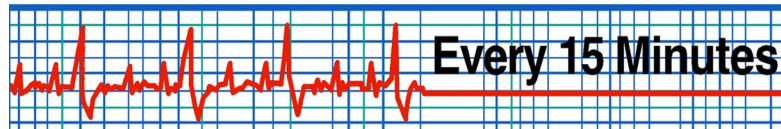

History



Every 15 Minutes is a two-day program focusing on the juniors & seniors of Pittsburg High School challenging them to think about impaired driving and the responsibility of making mature decisions behind the wheel.

Alcohol related traffic collisions are a major social, health, and economic problem. In 2022, there were 1,024 persons killed and 27,712 injured in impaired related vehicle crashes statewide. Teen and young adult drivers are responsible for a highly disproportionate number of these collisions, injuries and deaths.

Since 2020, Pittsburg PD has arrested approximately 557 individuals for impaired driving. These statistics fuel the need for proactive measures by the community.

Programs such as Every 15 Minutes, presentations by MADD, and law enforcement presentations are effective educational tools.



Pittsburg Police Department and Pittsburg Unified School District Goal



- In order to achieve our goal of reducing the number of teens involved in fatal crashes or injured in impaired related incidents, our community needs to work together.
- The Every 15 Minutes program helps building the relationships with the community and students of Pittsburg High School.



Overview Day 1

- One student is removed from class every 15 min by a PUSD and PPD employee. The student's obituary will be read to the remaining students in the class. These “living dead” will participate in a retreat later that night.
- A simulated drunk driving crash, involving preselected students is staged, on the football field to witness a DUI fatal crash investigation. Emergency personnel: AMR, Fire, PPD and the Coroner respond to the scene which is narrated to the student body. One student will be trapped and rescued, one student will be declared deceased, and one student will be ultimately arrested for driving impaired.



Overview Day 2

- Students return to Pittsburg High School for an assembly in Pittsburg Creative Art's building.
- Every 15 Minutes Video will be presented to the student body.
- Presentations from guest speakers, PPD, MADD, other emergency personnel will conclude the assembly.

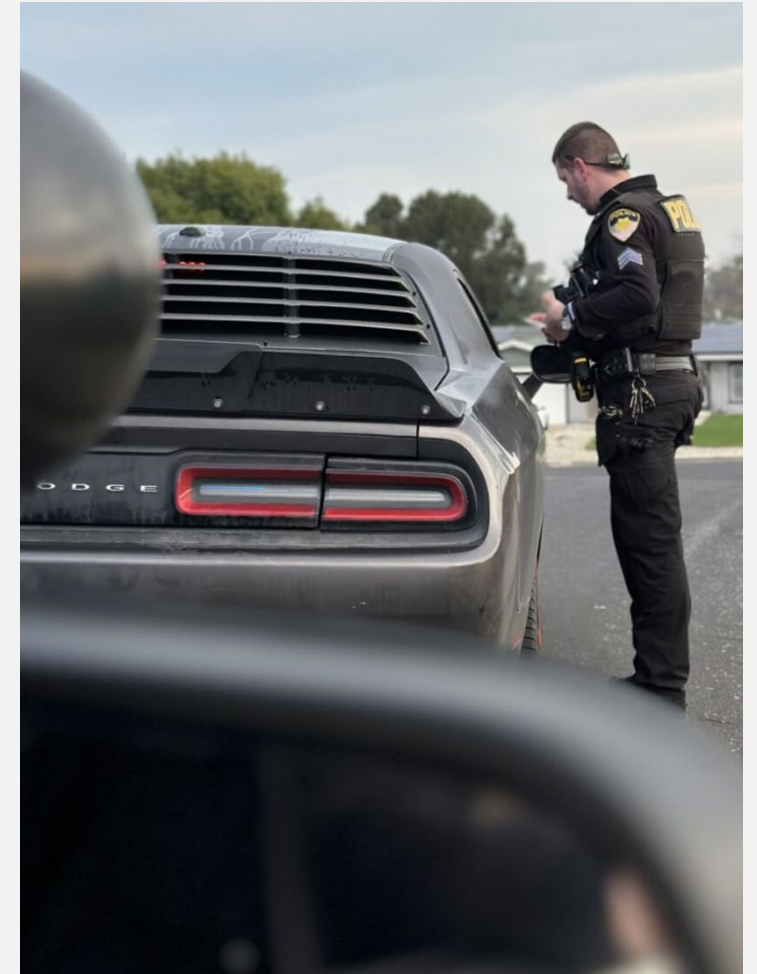

Milestone: Create an East County Crime Reduction Coalition and conduct quarterly meetings.

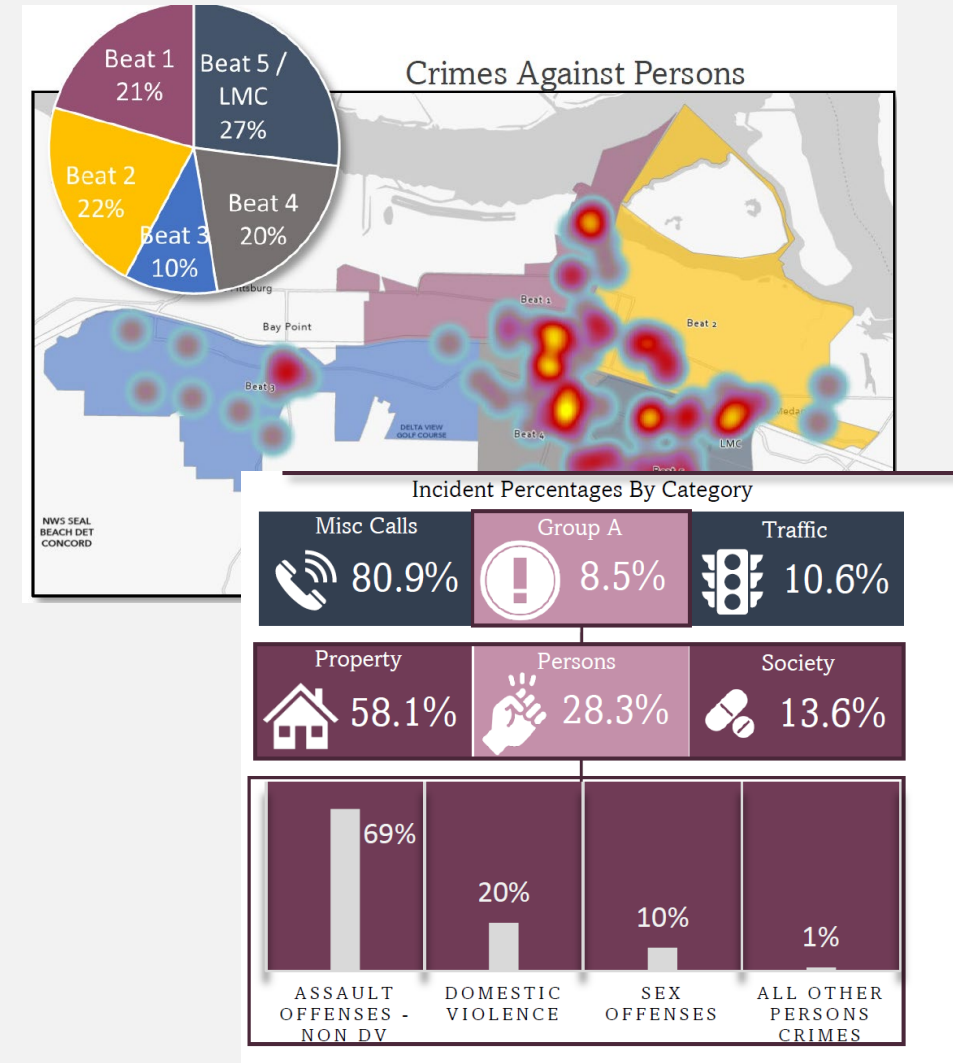




Implementation Measure 1.3

Milestone: Collaborate with key stakeholders to establish needs assessment related to service levels



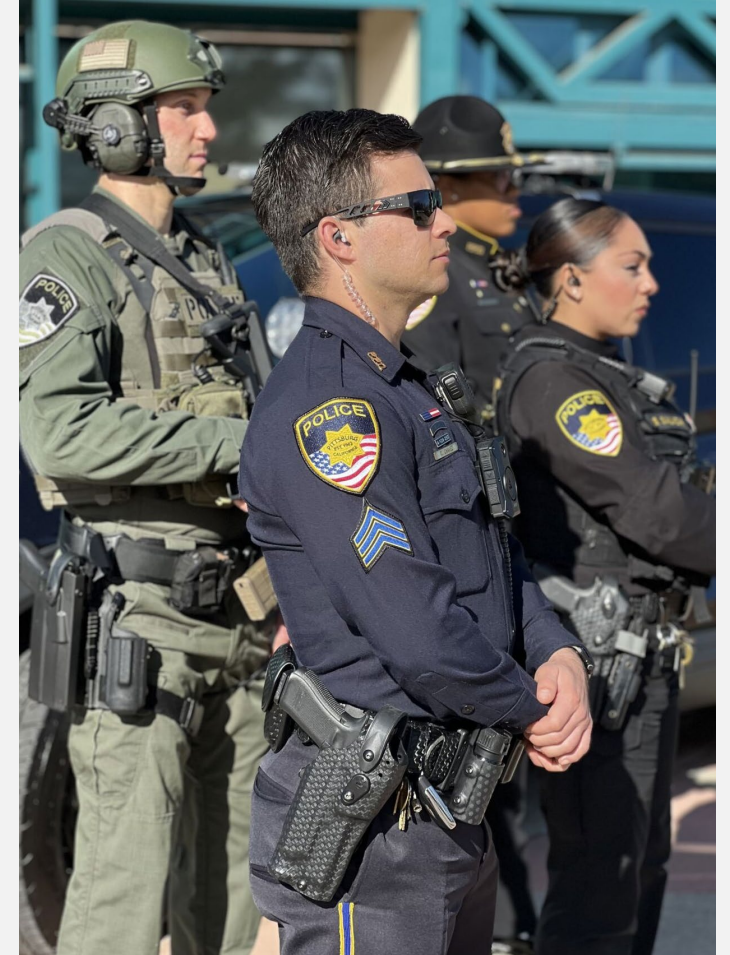


Implementation Measure 2.1

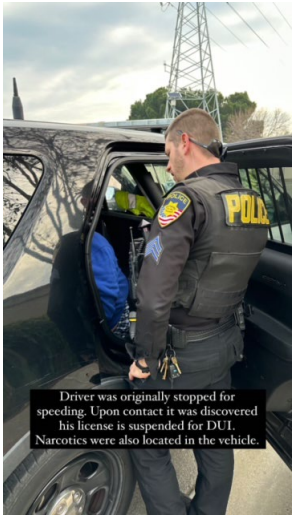

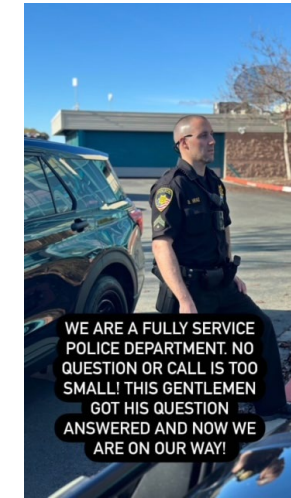


Virtual Social Media Ride Along

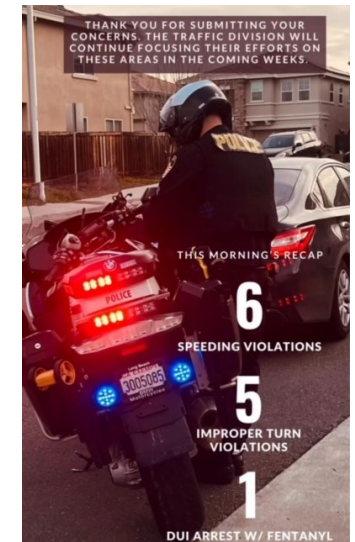
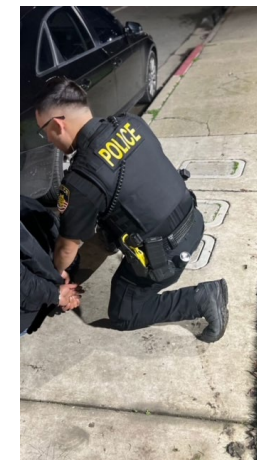
