#### **STATE OF THE ECONOMY ON PITTSBURG:**

- UNPRECEDENTED SEVERE ECONOMIC CRISS
- POLITICAL CHAOS IN SACRAMENTO CUTS TO LOCAL GOV'T
- FISCAL IMPACTS ON ALL ASPECTS OF COMMUNITY SERVICES
- CITY SERVICES GREATLY REDUCED
- BUDGET STRATEGY AND STABILIZATION PLAN
- \$6.2 MILLION BUDGET DEFICIT FOR FY 2009/10
- CITY REVENUE PROJECTIONS ARE VOLATILE
- STATE BUDGET IS \$21.3 BILLION IN THE RED
- STATE TAKEAWAYS IMMINENT AFTER MAY 19<sup>TH</sup> (CITY: \$888K)

### **REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY 2008/09:**

- FIRST PRIORITY: Major Long-Term Debt Restructuring (Reduced by \$18M)
- RDA TAX INCREMENT:
   (\$42M REVENUE REDUCED TO \$38M)
   (HOUSING: \$3M REDUCED TO \$2M)
- RE=PRIORITIZE RDA PROJECTS
- FOCUS: CAPITAL INVESTMENT
- SPECIFIC PROJECTS (UNDER CONSTRUCTION)
- FUTURE PROJECTS: (CONTINGENT ON ECONOMY)





### **C.I.P. INVESTMENT FOCUS:**

- 11 PUBLIC INFRASTRUCTURE
   PROJECTS COMPLETED IN 2008: \$30M
- 10 CIP PROJECTS OUT-TO-BID
   OR UNDER CONSTRUCTION: \$46M
- 12 CIP PROJECTS IN-DESIGN: \$13M

TOTAL C.I.P. INVESTMENT: \$61M





(Over next 5 years to improve parks, streets, storm drains, traffic signals, water facilities and public buildings)



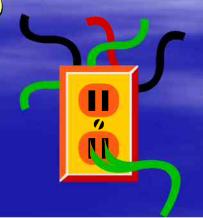
### PITTSBURG POWER COMPANY - BUSINESS ENTERPRISES

#### TRANS BAY CABLE PROJECT: (PROVIDES 40% OF SF POWER)

- 1. 53-mile, 400 MW, 200kV TRANSMISSION LINE (Pittsburg to San Francisco Under Bay Installed in October November 2009.
- 2. PITTSBURG CONVERTER STATION (UNDER CONSTRUCTION; Slated to be energized September 1, 2009
- 3. PPC Own ALL Project Assts upon Commercial Operations
- 4. COMMERCIAL OPERATION DATE: MARCH 20, 2010

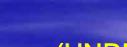

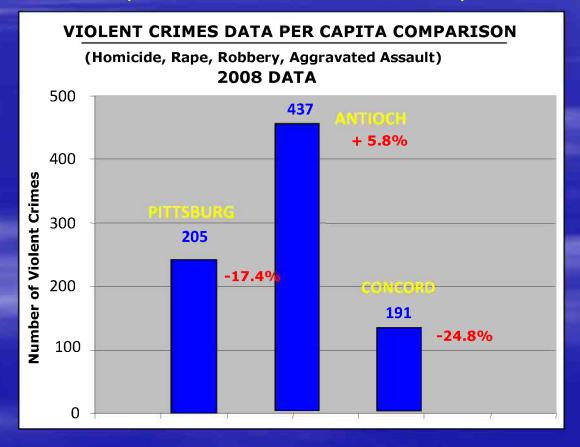
