

Report ALL Suspicious Activity to the Police

- Anyone looking into parked cars
- A stranger lurking around a neighbor's home
- Anyone loitering around neighborhood schools
- Anyone carrying unwrapped property down the street
- Anyone peering into a home
- Any suspicious occupied vehicle
- Vehicles parked in the neighborhood for an abnormal amount of time
- Cars, vans, or trucks moving slowly with no apparent destination, or without lights

Neighborhood Watch is one of the most effective and least costly ways to prevent crime and reduce fear. It is a shared responsibility between the police and community.

The goal is to make Pittsburg a safer and more comfortable city through crime prevention and problem solving strategies. It is part of the overall philosophy of Pittsburg's Community Policing.

Neighborhood Watch fights the isolation that crime both creates and feeds upon. It forges bonds among area residents, helps reduce burglaries and robberies, and improves relations between the community and our police.

Where to Begin...

Contact the Neighborhood Watch Office

Organize a small planning committee (or start-up meeting of neighbors to discuss need, level of interest, and community problems

Schedule your first meeting at a convenient place and time

Contact the Neighborhood Watch Office to coordinate a Police Department representatives attendance

Invite neighbors to attend and ask for volunteers to bring refreshments, folding chairs, escorts for seniors or disabled, etc.

During the initial meeting, select a coordinator and ask for a block captain to relay information to the members and be the point of contact for the Police Department.

Who Can Be Involved...

Any community resident can join- young or old, renter or homeowner.

How It Works...

Neighbors get to know each other and work together

Implement crime prevention techniques and strategies in homes and neighborhoods

Help solve neighborhood problems through a partnership between you and your Police department
