

REDUCTION OF LONG-TERM LIABILITIES

Good Stewardship of resources requires proactive financial actions by the City.

In the last 12 months, six bonds were refinanced resulting in over \$40 million in savings, while reducing the interest rate paid and shortening the maturity dates.


PITTSBURG'S PROPERTY VALUES AND SALES TAX IMPROVEMENT




PITTSBURG'S HOUSING INDICATORS

- Median sale prices of homes continue to rise (\$355,000), with a 15% increase over last years median sales price (\$310,000)
- Average price per square foot has increased from \$104 to \$208 over the past 5 years
- Foreclosures and short sales of singlefamily homes continue to fall. In 2015 distressed sales accounted for only 8% of all sales, compared to 14% last year










VIOLENT CRIME COMPARISON 2015


Total Violent Crimes per Capita 1000




VIOLENT CRIME COMPARISON BY CITY

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
